Important things



People with disability must be included from the start.



Ask people what they need so that they can be included:

- Extra time.
- Support staff.
- Access.
- Travel needs.
- Information they can read.
- Training.



Meetings must include everyone:

- Not be too long.
- Have breaks.
- Time to get to know people.
